
The triple threat in Kenya

Background

Kenya is committed to ending HIV as a public health threat by 2030. AIDS related deaths have reduced by 67% from 58,446 in 2013 to 19,486 in 2021; attributed to the 83% increase in the number of people on antiretroviral treatment from 656,369 in 2013 to 1,199,101 in 2021. New HIV infections have also reduced by 68.4% from 101,448 in 2013 to 32,027 in 2021 with an attendant decline in HIV prevalence from 6% to 4% during this period. HIV transmission from mother to child has also reduced from 13.9% in 2013 to 9.7% in 2021, averting an estimated 65,000 new HIV infections among children between 2013 and 2020.

Kenya has a predominantly young population, with 59% aged 24 years and below. Whereas a 47% reduction in AIDS-related deaths was registered among adolescents and young people between 2015 and 2021, this population continues to be disproportionately affected by HIV compared to older adults. In 2021, 42% of new adult HIV infections were attributed to adolescents and young people aged 15-24 years with significant geographical variations.

The 'Triple Threat Campaign' is a multisectoral, whole government approach to ending new HIV infections, unintended pregnancies, and sexual and gender-based violence among adolescent girls and young women by addressing the drivers of risk and vulnerability in this population.



1.0 Country and county population profile

Kenya has high youthful population with about **59%** of the population aged **below 24**. This is slightly higher in **Trans Nzoia County** where **64%** of the population is below **24 years**. *(Source: 2019 Census, KNBS)*.




Figure 1: Population distribution in Kenya and Trans Nzoia County **Source:** KNBS 2019 Population Census




Figure 2: Adolescent new HIV infections per sub county, Source: HIV Estimates 2021




Figure 3: Female adolescents testing HIV positive per sub county (July 2021 – May 2022) **Source:** KHIS_MOH 731_1

> Adolescents living with HIV:

- Nationally, there are an estimated 99,159 adolescents aged 10-19 living with HIV
- of whom 1.5% (1,557) were in Trans Nzoia County. (2021, HIV Estimates)

> Adolescents' new HIV Infections:

- new HIV infections among adolescents aged 10-19 reduced by 71% from 18,004 in
 2015 to 5,294 in 2021 translating to 98 new HIV infections every week.
- o **Trans Nzoia county** recorded a **34%** reduction in the same period.
- Adolescents aged 10-19 in Kiminini sub county contributed to 15.6% of the total estimated new HIV infections (102) across the respective sub-counties (2021)

> AIDS related deaths among adolescents:

- o Despite a 47% decline in AIDS related deaths among adolescents in the country,
- Trans Nzoia County had a higher reduction of 64% in AIDS related deaths among adolescents between 2015 and 2021.

Routine HIV testing:

- In Trans Nzoia County, 65% (63) of the total adolescents HIV positive tests (97)
 between July 2021 and May 2022 were among females aged 10-19
- o with **Kiminini sub county** leading at a HIV positivity rate of **3.8%**

Condom use:

 According to Kenya Demographic and Health Survey (2014), sexually active females aged 15-49 aware of condom use as a protection strategy against HIV infection accounted for 86.3% in Trans Nzoia County.




Figure 4: Annual adolescent pregnancies in Trans Nzoia County (2016 - 2021) **Source:** Kenya Health Information System (KHIS MOH 711)




Figure 5: Adolescent pregnancies across sub counties in Trans Nzoia County (Jan-May 2022) **Source:** Kenya Health Information System (KHIS MOH 711)

Sexual Debut:

o In **Trans Nzoia County**, the median age at first sexual intercourse among women aged 20-49 was **17.8**. (**Kenya Demographic and Health Survey**_ 2014). Baringo county had a slightly lower median age at first sex (17.6) while Nakuru was 18.7

> Early marriages

Child marriage often drives early pregnancy and in some instances, pregnancy may also precede marriage, and act as a trigger for child marriage or early union. In **Trans** Nzoia County, 9.7% of females were reported to have been ever married by age 15-19 (2022 Economic survey, KNBS)

> Adolescent pregnancies:

Adolescent pregnancies remain high in the country with an average of 25% in the last
 6 years. Nationally, 1 in every 5 women presenting for 1st ANC (20.4%) was an adolescent aged 10-19 in 2021.

- Nationally, the proportion of adolescent pregnancies aged 10-19 years have declined
 by 26% between 2018 and 2021. However, the proportion of girls aged 10-14
 attending ANC increased by 23% between 2020 and 2021.
- The gradual decline in the proportion of adolescents aged 10-19 attending ANC was also observed in **Trans Nzoia County** from 11,979 in **2018** to 7413 in **2021**. Overall, Trans Nzoia County recorded a 33% decline in adolescent pregnancies compared to 22% decline in Nakuru County and 26% in Baringo county between 2018 and 2021.
- O Between **January to May 2022**, **17%** of the total ANC attendances (**627,621**) were by adolescents aged 10-19 **in the country**. This was **higher** in **Trans Nzoia County** at **22%** with a total of **11,839** ANC attendances
- Between January and May 2022, adolescents aged 10-19 accounted for 30% of all new ANC attendances in Endebess sub county. Notably, Saboti sub county contributed to 25% of the total (2,622) adolescent pregnancies.

3.2 Sexual and gender-based violence among adolescents aged 10-17




Figure 6: Annual SGBV cases reported among adolescents in Trans Nzoia County **Source:** Kenya Health Information System (KHIS MOH 711)




Figure 7: SGBV cases reported among adolescents across sub counties in Trans Nzoia County **Source:** Kenya Health Information System (KHIS MOH 711)

- Nationally, 1 in every 2 SGVB cases (42.4%) reported was an adolescent aged 10-17 in 2021. Notably, an 84% increase was observed in the number of SGBV cases recorded among adolescents aged 10-17years from 6,340 in 2017 to 38,842 in 2021.
- ➤ In 2021, **58%** of the total SGBV cases recorded in **Trans Nzoia County** were among adolescents aged 10-17. Similarly, a **97% increase** in the number of SGBV cases recorded among adolescents aged 10-17 was noted between **2017** and **2021**.
- > Over the last 6 years, burden of SGBV among adolescents aged 10-17 years stood at 67% compared to Nakuru and Baringo Counties which stood at 46% and 18% respectively.
- ➤ In 2022 (January-May), **71%** of SGBV cases among adolescents aged 10-17 were recorded in **Kiminini sub county**




Figure 8: Adolescent female sex workers across sub counties in Trans Nzoia County **Source:** Kenya Health Information System (KHIS MOH 731 B Plus)

- o **In December 2021**, there were **7,592** adolescent female sex workers aged 15-19 in the **country** with 0.7% of these adolescents (56) being reported in **Trans Nzoia County**.
- Additionally, 61% of adolescent female sex workers aged 15-19 were recorded in Saboti sub county.

> Injection Drug use:

- The **prevalence of HIV** among people who use drugs in the **country** stands at **18%**.
- There are an estimated **26**, **673** people who inject drugs with **0.7% (180)** estimated to be in **Trans Nzoia County**.
- As of December 2021, only 63% (16,725) were reported as active of whom 1% (161) were adolescents aged 15-19. Trans Nzoia County had no active people who inject drugs reported.

II. Poverty Index:

- In 2020, the overall poverty incidence rate in Kenya was 36.1% while that of Trans Nzoia
 County was at 34%. (Kenya economic Report (KIPPRA 2020), KNBS (2018).
- In **2020**, only **2%** of poor households with orphans are beneficiaries of a cash transfer programme in **Trans Nzoia County**.
